School-Based Mental Health

Most if not all schools in Hennepin County are returning to in-person learning. Our school mental health providers have been doing a great job of pivoting back to the school building and providing in-person therapy students and families and support to school staff. Many of the agencies have done this on and off throughout the fall and there has been a mix of excitement and anxiety as they come back into schools. At our last HC SMH meeting much of the discussion was about different ways to support clinicians getting vaccines and ways to support them as they return to the school building. Also there were discussions about PPE and health and safety procedures. Many school mental health providers still have openings to serve more students and families but as some agencies have been back in school now for 3-4 weeks, they have noticed a slow increase in referrals, which is wonderful. So we are hoping that being back in-person learning has helped students get identified for the support they need and families able to access care more easily.
